

# **OUR MISSION STATEMENT**

With God's support we are developing Portland as a dynamic, Spirit-led Church impacting on our town and beyond through encouragement, nurture and service

was given a tulip kit and a hyacinth kit around Christmas. The hyacinth kit, I kept in a dark place for 8-12 weeks and the tulip kit, I was to keep in a warm place. The hyacinth was placed under the kitchen sink in order to begin to grow and grow it did. Through December and into January, the bulb emerged and by the beginning of February the plant began to flower, but because it was under the sink and no sunlight reached it, it was white. I finally decided to take it out from underneath the sink and within 24 hours the white plant had turned a beautiful shade of purple and pink.



Likewise, the tulip plant sat in my utility room. It is a room with some light, but mainly supports the on-going, never-ending, laundry process and our boiler. While these have not bloomed yet, the tulip stems are well over 18 inches long right now. I think I might have done something wrong with these.

I actually don't know if I did the hyacinths correctly either. I feel like they shouldn't be blooming just yet. These are meant to be spring flowers and we are not quite at spring yet. I always associate these bright spring flowers with Easter, and we are not yet to Easter morning. The daffodils, the tulips, the hyacinths, they do bring us such colour and life after such a dark, cold, stormy winter.

But we only start our Lenten journey this week. And, like growing flowers, Lent takes time. We need the forty days (plus weekends) to prepare for the Easter Event. We need time to pause at the transfiguration, knowing that we are forever changed when the thin veil, the liminality, between holy and mundane is exposed. We need to wander out into the wilderness with Jesus and be confronted with images of God as a mothering hen. We need to come face to face with the prodigal son and journey towards the cross. And that is what we will do this Lenten season.

I hope you know that you are always welcome to journey with Portland Church through all walks of life. But this Lenten season, know that you are particularly welcome.

14 April - Maundy Thursday, communion and service at Troon Old, time TBD


15 April - Good Friday, Service of Darkness at Portland Parish Church, time TBD

# <u>An Invitation to join a Troon Church Together Choir for Easter Vigil at St</u> Ninian's

I, Keith Thomasson, Rector of St Ninian's Troon, wish to create a **Troon Churches Together Choir** to lead the 20.30 Easter Vigil service on Holy Saturday 16 April, at St Ninian's.

At this service we will light an Easter fire, renew our shared baptism calling, and hear the Easter Gospel. The Revd Dr Anne-Claar will preside. All will be invited to share in bread and wine, if they so wish and feel able to do so, gathering at the Lord's table.

I want to invite all who wish to sing and/or play an instrument at this event to get in touch. The willingness to participate is the only requirement alongside gathering to rehearse together. You might understand this as a Lenten discipline, an opportunity to grow spiritually, to invest in wellbeing, and to nurture relationships in community.

I will shape the music in accordance with the gifting present. I hope that we will sing a selection of the following: hymns, global chants, Taizé, plainchant, a Latin motet. People will do what they can and do it as well as possible. Groups and individuals will contribute in different ways (hopefully as a community choir, solo voices, and a small consort of experienced singers).

It would also be wonderful to have melody instruments, percussion, and keyboard players contributing both separately, and with the singers.

Our organist Anne Kennedy will accompany the hymns.

Naturally this will require some communal and individual preparation. I invite all those who wish to participate/enquire to do so by *Friday 11 March* if possible. Do invite friends to get involved with you. I can then plan repertoire and rehearsal content.

# **Live Online Service**

Portland Church has purchased the equipment to enable the service to be broadcast live on a Sunday morning. It is a basic system with one video camera mounted on the balcony. Once sufficient expertise is obtained it would be possible to expand the system with more cameras.

The website has been changed slightly to give access to the new livestream.



Clicking or tapping in the top left hand box will take you to the website page where access to the livestream can be obtained. If this is clicked on before 10.25 am a timer will be seen counting down the time till the start of the broadcast which will be a few minutes before the start of the service. This allows the pre-service activity to be seen and music to be heard. The broadcast will stop soon after the end of the benediction hymn. YouTube also records the service so it will be available from this same link for one week.

The second box on the top row allows access to a page where the current service and the previous two services can be viewed.

Portland is looking for some volunteers to operate the system as part of a rota. A period of training and supervised operation would be given before anyone would be asked to operate it on their own.
