a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance.

Within this passage is the comfort that we who are alive now experience life just as people have always done, and we can take strength in knowing that the many things we encounter in our lives are part of the tapestry of human existence. I hope that as the church community of Troon continues to make progress towards their new future there will indeed be a time to dance once everything is settled. FORMING A CHURCH UNION – UPDATE

Your representatives have been very busy — no rest over the summer! Troon Church of Scotland has been accepted as the new name for the union of the churches of Troon old, Troon St Meddan's and Troon Portland.

The next step is to write a Basis of Union – a document which has to be approved by Presbytery, then the Law Department of the Church of Scotland and then the Principal Clerk of the Church of Scotland. This Basis of Union will then be sent back to us, the Kirk Sessions and congregations for final approval. This has proved complicated as the guidelines and advice keep changing but I am confident we have produced a comprehensive Basis of Union which now needs approval from Presbytery.

You may ask, how long will this take? Our hope is that Presbytery approve this document at their meeting on the 10th of September and then pass it up the chain for approval.

We will make this Basis of Union available as soon as it has been approved. We will keep you updated.

Meanwhile we continue to move closer together as one congregation by sharing worship together. These joint services have been very well received and we will continue to worship together as one congregation on the second Sunday of each month for the rest of this year. We will then review this and decide how we worship together next year.

We are moving slowly forward in faith.
